Hornaday Returns to the site of Memorable 50th-Career Win

- Ron Hornaday will make his 11th-career start at Kentucky Speedway when he takes the green flag Thursday night for the UNOH 225. In his previous 10 starts at the 1.5-mile track, Hornaday has three wins, one pole and three top-five and six top-10 finishes.
- Kentucky Speedway will always have a special meaning to Hornaday as it is the site of his 50th-career NASCAR Camping World Truck Series victory. Hornaday earned the historic win on October 1, 2011. This weekend Hornaday will be looking to earn his 52nd-career win and fourth win at the track when he climbs behind the wheel of the No. 9 Anderson's Maple Syrup/Kroger Chevrolet Silverado.
- The sweet look of the Anderson's Maple Syrup will return to the No. 9 Chevrolet Silverado this weekend with Kroger as an associate sponsor for the team.
- While the NASCAR Sprint Cup Series and Nationwide Series teams spent this past weekend racing on the twist and turns of road courses, Ron Hornaday returned to his home state to receive his induction into the West Coast Hall of Fame. On June 20, 2013, his 55th birthday, Ron Hornaday Jr. was inducted into the West Coast Hall of Fame at a special dinner held at the Meritage Resort in Napa, California. Kevin Harvick introduced Hornaday with NTS Motorsports owner Bob Newberry, teammate Brennan Newberry and friend and fellow driver Rick Carelli all in attendance for the special honor.
- Catch the UNOH 225 from Kentucky Speedway on MRN, Sirius Satellite Radio Channel 90 and SPEED on Thursday, June 27, beginning at 7:30 p.m. ET.
